


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Buried Treasure!

"SATs week was the most fun week at school," Oliver Hudson.








Brilliant Book Reviews!



1. First, draw a triangle towards the left.




2. Then, draw a slightly curved line.




3. Then, draw a triangular shape for the mouth.



Holes, by Louis Sachar, is an interesting book about a 14-year-old boy called Stanley Yelnats, whose family has a history of bad luck. He was accused of stealing Clyde Livingston's baseball shoes which resulted in him having a choice between jail or going to Camp Green Lake. Camp Green Lake is a dry, flat wasteland where boys are sent to serve their punishment for crime by digging one hole a day which is the length and width of their shovel. The problem with this is that the boys must work in the scorching hot sun every day until they have dug their hole.

Over the time he has been there, Stanley got called by the name of caveman by his new friends. Zero, a guiet boy, is often scowling and angry looking, though Stanley notices that when Zero smiles, his smile seems too big for his face. The two of them made an agreement that Zero would dig Stanley's hole and Stanley would teach him. 


