

Our Governors

Community Primary Schools are here to serve their community and the staff work hard to meet the needs of all our children and meet the expectations of our parents. To hold us to account, the school has a Governing Body to which the Head Teacher reports on every aspect of school life.

What is a Governing Body?

The Governing Body is made up of volunteers who are passionate about the education of the children at our school. It plays an important role in the strategic management of the school and in shaping our ethos. The Governing Body meets at least once every term and its minutes are on display in school.

School governors are drawn from different parts of the community and can be parents, staff, co-opted from the community, or nominated from the Local Authority. It is important the governing body has sufficient diversity of views and experience to undertake the wide range of responsibilities it has.

Our governing body consists of 16 members who each take on different responsibilities for monitoring the school's progress and holding the school's leadership to account.

Why do we have one?

The Governing Body has a range of duties and powers with a view to promoting high standards of educational achievement. Its responsibilities include:

- Helping to establish the aims and policies of the schools
- Working strategically to help raise standards
- Supporting the Head Teacher and staff
- Making sure the curriculum is balanced and broadly based
- Appointing staff
- Managing the budget

Finance and General Purposes Committee – covering finance, health and safety and premises management
Pupils and Personnel Committee – covering staff appointments and performance, safeguarding, special needs and disability provision, attendance and behaviour, parental issues and concerns, equality issues and inclusion

Strategic Development Committee – covering pupil attainment and progress, curriculum development and monitoring, school improvement planning and inspection outcomes.

Committee members have agreed delegated responsibilities and usually meet twice a term.
