



3. My child is happy at school (0 point)





5. The school makes sure that children are well-behaved (0 point)









- Inclusion

There were some suggestions made for future improvements which have been given full consideration and will be addressed proportionally. The most common answers were:

- Online payments to be rectified
- A better system required for paying for trips
- Use of a parent app
